offer quality outpatient clinic and community-based behavioral health and addictive disease treatment services for children, adolescents and their families in Fulton County.

Behavioral Health Services for Senior Citizens

is a collaboration between Behavioral Health and Human Services. This team provides monthly presentations at Fulton County Senior Multipurpose Centers about healthy mind, body and spirit. The services include screenings, consultations and referrals for appropriate services.

The Behavioral Health Information Line

is available for Fulton County residents to receive information regarding behavioral health services. Individuals may also can receive a behavioral health screening from a licensed clinician over the telephone and will be referred to the appropriate services. Ongoing services are available at any of the behavioral health centers. Appointments can be made by calling (404) 613-3675, Monday thru Friday from 8:30 AM to 5:00 PM. Behavioral Health Training, Consultation, and Community Education



program provides community education and consultation regarding behavioral health, addictive diseases, developmental disabilities, and other related behavioral health issues.

collaborates with the Fulton County Jail, Fulton County Magistrate, State Court, and Superior Mental Health Court and offers services and supports for individuals with behavioral health and addictive disease disorders.


Services for Adults with Developmental Disabilities (DD)

Dental Health Services offers oral health services for children and adults including exams, x-rays, cleanings, nerve treatments, extractions, white and silver fillings, and emergency treatments. Dental Services are available at select locations throughout the County.

Women's Health/Family Planning Program promotes and protects the health and well being of women and their families through education and prevention.



Programs include:

- Title X Family Planning (exams and contraceptives)
- Cervical Cancer Screening Program
- Women's Health Medicaid
- Breast and Cervical Cancer Program,
- Sterilizations (male and female)
- Perinatal Case Management
- Routine screenings such as sexually transmitted infections, HIV, RPR, anemia and glucose

Communicable Disease Prevention Branch

strives to reduce the incidence of sexually transmitted infections, including HIV, through surveillance, prevention, education, screening, treatment, contact notification and appropriate medical and social referrals to prevent the spread of diseases. Services are offered through three clinics: **HIV, STI** and **TB**.

Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI) Clinic offers:

- Physical assessments
- HIV testing and counseling
- Treatment of infections
- Medication dispensing
- Education, medical and social referrals
- On-site State-licensed laboratory to obtain specimens

HIV Primary Care Clinic offers:

- Medical HIV Services
- Behavioral Health Services
- Basic Dental Services
- Case Management
- Health Education
- On-site Pharmacy
- Support Group for HIV positive individuals

Tuberculosis (TB) Control Clinic offers:

- Tuberculosis (TB) treatment
- Directly Observed Therapy (DOT)
- Chest X-Rays (for TB treatment only)
- HIV pre/post-test counseling (TB patients)
- Lab Work
- Appointments and walk-in services

Travel Clinic offers vaccination for travel abroad. Travel Clinics are available at North Fulton Regional Health Center, the Center for Health and Rehabilitation, North Fulton Service Center and College Park Health Center.



Our Clinic Nurses will go over your travel plans to determine your vaccination needs and advise about precautions you will need to take during your travels.

Immunizations Program goal is to protect the community from vaccine preventable diseases by providing:

- Vaccines to people of all ages
- On site vaccinations in the community
- Community services thru school and day care audits
- Immunizations 5 days per week, extended hours and weekends
- Walk-in immunizations in eight clinic sites

The Refugee Health Program (RHP) offers Fulton County's newly arriving refugee residents direct or referral services to promote physical, mental, nutritional and social well-being.

Primary Care Screening Clinic provides services for Ages 18 and up, including:

- Chronic Disease Screening and Early Treatment
- General Assessments
- Preventive Care
- Health Maintenance
- Diabetes and Hypertension Screening
- Routine Laboratory Tests
- Referrals
